The art challenges the technology, and the technology inspires the art.

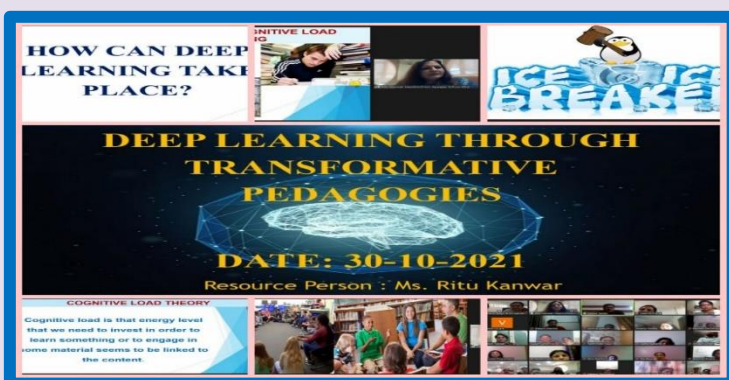
